



In English, we will be working hard to consolidate all of the different aspects of writing we have been working on this year. We will focus on a book called 'The Starlings Song', which will give us a chance to learn all about birds.

In our reading lessons, we will be focusing on inference and using the Reading Vipers to help us answer questions about different types of text.

The children should spend some time talking about their own books at home and sharing the different things they have learnt. We have been looking at summarising things into a few sentences.

In Science, we are learning all about living things and their habitats. We will be looking at plants to begin with and finding out about pollination and how this ultimately ends with a new plant.

This topic will continue into next half term where we focus on life cycles and reproduction.

In DT, we will continue to look at circuits and build an alarm by the end of this year. This topic will take place over the next two half terms.

In RE, we will focus on Buddhism and Sikhism and look at what worship means within daily life.

In Maths, the children will be looking at a variety of different topics: fractions, decimals and percentages, negative numbers.

Children must focus on their multiplication this term and practise arithmetic regularly. This will help with the transition into year 6.
